5 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close  
6 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021; to provide  
7 appropriations from special funds and accounts to the  
8 Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July  
9 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, and for the payment of bills  
10 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
11 30, 2021; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds  
12 to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year  
13 July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, and for the payment of bills  
14 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
15 30, 2021; and to provide for the additional appropriation of  
16 Federal and State funds to the Executive and Judicial  
17 Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2020, to June 30,  
18 2021, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining  
19 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 PART I

15 GENERAL PROVISIONS

16 Section 101. Short title.

17 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General  
18 Appropriation Act of 2021.

19 Section 102. Definitions.

20 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall  
21 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the  
22 context clearly indicates otherwise:

23 "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious  
24 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus  
25 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,  
26 China.

27 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,  
28 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

29 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
30 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant

1 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
2 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
3 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
4 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
5 other assistants in a department, board or commission.

6 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
7 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
8 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
9 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,  
10 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll  
11 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising  
12 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,  
13 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of  
14 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and  
15 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums  
16 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on  
17 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer  
18 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee  
19 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,  
20 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and  
21 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the  
22 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery  
23 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment  
24 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other  
25 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for  
26 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of  
27 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term  
28 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the  
29 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must  
30 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case

1 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that  
2 provided under the State medical assistance program.

3 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the  
4 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

26 (a) General Fund.--Except as provided in Part XIX, the sums  
27 specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,  
28 are specifically appropriated from the General Fund to agencies  
29 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
30 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other

1 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
2 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
3 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
4 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
5 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
6 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
7 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
8 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes specified  
9 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of  
10 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior  
11 fiscal year.

12 (b) Special funds and accounts.--Except as provided in Part  
13 XIX, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may  
14 be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special  
15 funds and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the  
16 Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the  
17 payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel  
18 expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the  
19 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services  
20 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and  
21 for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this  
22 act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions  
23 and activities and for the purposes specified in this act for  
24 the current fiscal year and for the payment of bills incurred  
25 and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior fiscal year.

26 Section 105. Federal appropriations.

27 Except as otherwise provided in section 1902, the Federal  
28 appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may  
29 be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of  
30 the Executive Department of the Commonwealth specified in this

1 act for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying  
2 out the programs specified in this act for the current fiscal  
3 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
4 at the close of the prior fiscal year. Unless otherwise stated,  
5 the Federal appropriations include any carryovers from the prior  
6 fiscal year.

22 Section 5161. Lapsing of unused funds.

23 Except as otherwise provided by law, that part of all

24 appropriations in this part unexpended, uncommitted or

25 unencumbered at the close of the prior fiscal year shall

26 automatically lapse as of that day.

27 PART LXI

28 SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS

29 FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR

30 Section 6101. General Fund repository for Federal funds.

1 Moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions  
2 or supplements to the departments or agencies of the  
3 Commonwealth or the programs provided in this act shall be paid  
4 into the General Fund.

5 Section 6102. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal  
6 funds.

7 Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent  
8 that the money is estimated as being available during the fiscal  
9 year of the Commonwealth.

10 Section 6103. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal funds.

11 (a) General rule.--Federal moneys that have been previously  
12 appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated  
13 by the Federal Government but remain unspent from the prior  
14 fiscal year or previous fiscal years and will not be renewed for  
15 the current fiscal year are appropriated.

16 (b) Department of Human Services.--The Federal  
17 appropriations to the Department of Human Services include any  
18 prior earnings that may be received during the current fiscal  
19 year. In addition to the amounts specifically appropriated in  
20 this act to the Department of Human Services, all moneys  
21 appropriated from the Federal Government during a previous  
22 fiscal year which are expected to be received as reimbursements  
23 may be carried forward until the close of the current fiscal  
24 year to the extent that obligations are carried forward. In  
25 addition, reimbursements actually received to support the  
26 obligations may also be carried forward.

27 Section 6104. Subgrants between Federal appropriations.

28 Subgrants may be made between Federal appropriations without  
29 further approval of the General Assembly. The Secretary of the  
30 Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to the chair and

1 minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and  
2 the chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of  
3 the House of Representatives quarterly. No subgrant to a State  
4 agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt account  
5 without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.

6 Section 6105. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.

7 (a) Natural disasters and civil disobedience.--Federal funds  
8 available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters  
9 or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained  
10 in this act or to funds otherwise appropriated or may be used  
11 for the purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

12 (b) Other emergencies.--In addition to the moneys  
13 appropriated by this act, moneys received from the Federal  
14 Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief, or  
15 other moneys received as a direct result of terrorist acts,  
16 moneys for homeland security and defense and moneys for avian  
17 flu/pandemic preparedness shall be paid into the General Fund  
18 and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments,  
19 boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.

20 (c) Executive authorization.--In the event of an emergency  
21 situation in which the General Assembly cannot act in sufficient  
22 time, the Governor is authorized through executive authorization  
23 to provide up to \$10,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the  
24 emergency situation.

25 (d) Definition.--For the purposes of this section,  
26 "emergency" is defined as a situation in which there is a chance  
27 of or which may result in substantial human suffering.

28 Section 6106. Transfer of funds from TANFBG to CCDFBG and SSBG.

29 In accordance with Federal law which permits the transfer of  
30 funds from the TANFBG to the CCDFBG and SSBG, the Department of

1 Human Services, upon approval of the Secretary of the Budget,  
2 may transfer funds, provided that the transfer will not result  
3 in a deficit in an appropriation from which funds are  
4 transferred. The Secretary of the Budget shall provide 10 days'  
5 prior notification of the transfer to the chair and the minority  
6 chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the  
7 chair and minority chair of the Appropriations Committee of the  
8 House of Representatives.

10 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

11 FOR CURRENT FISCAL YEAR

12 Section 7101. Prior laws unaffected.

13 This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal  
14 any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of  
15 the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the  
16 ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and  
17 use of motor vehicles, the method of making payments from the  
18 State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any  
19 administrative department, board or commission.

20 Section 7102. Compliance with other law before funds available.

21 No appropriation made by this act to any department, board,  
22 commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be  
23 available unless and until the department, board, commission or  
24 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of  
25 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative  
26 Code of 1929.

27 Section 7103. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or  
28 committing funds.

29 Funds available to agencies, boards, departments, commissions  
30 or other governmental entities under this act for the

1 procurement of supplies, services or construction shall not be  
2 available for payment of or to be committed to or encumbered for  
3 payment of the procurement unless and until the agency, board,  
4 department or other governmental entity has complied with all of  
5 the requirements applicable to the procurement that are  
6 specified in 62 Pa.C.S. (relating to procurement) and in the  
7 policies, procedures and regulations instituted in accordance  
8 with 62 Pa.C.S.

9 Section 7104. Minority business set-asides.

10 (a) Duty to report.--Each department or other  
11 instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part  
12 II authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities,  
13 equipment, supplies or services shall report to the General  
14 Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement  
15 needs at the beginning of each quarter during a fiscal year.

16 (b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "minority  
17 business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the  
18 act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the  
19 Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

20 Section 7105. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous  
21 sources.

22 In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act:

23 (1) Moneys received in payment for food and household  
24 supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except  
25 inmates, by an institution and moneys received from the  
26 proceeds from the sale of products of the soil, meats,  
27 livestock, timber or other materials sold by a department or  
28 agency of the Commonwealth shall be paid into the General  
29 Fund and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the  
30 several respective institutions for the operation and

1 maintenance of the institutions.

2 (2) Moneys received from any other source, except the  
3 Federal Government, as contributions for the purposes  
4 specified in the respective appropriations or as payment for  
5 services or materials furnished by one institution to  
6 another, except those collections designated as revenues,  
7 shall be paid into the General Fund and are appropriated out  
8 of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective  
9 appropriations.

10 (3) Moneys received by a department or agency of the  
11 Commonwealth from other sources, except the Federal  
12 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department  
13 or agency for a program or administration of an act included  
14 in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited  
15 to the appropriation for that program or administration of  
16 the act.

17 Section 7106. Lapsing of unused funds.

18 (a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided by law or by  
19 this section, that part of all appropriations in this act  
20 unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of the close of the  
21 current fiscal year shall automatically lapse as of that day.

22 (b) Exceptions.--The following shall be continuing  
23 appropriations:

24 (1) The appropriation in section 236 to the Health Care  
25 Cost Containment Council.

26 (2) The appropriation in section 241 to the Supreme  
27 Court for the unified judicial system security program.

28 (3) The appropriations in Subpart C of Part II to the  
29 General Assembly.

30 (4) The appropriations in Subpart D of Part II to the

1 Government Support Agencies.

2 (c) Nonapplicability.--This section does not apply to Part  
3 XIX.

4 Section 7107. Appellate courts appropriation contingency.

5 The appropriations in sections 241, 242 and 243 to the  
6 Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts, respectively, for  
7 justice and judge expenses are contingent upon a vouchered  
8 expense account plan being continued by the Supreme Court.

9 Section 7108. Transfer of excess funds.

10 The Governor may transfer moneys in funds receiving proceeds  
11 of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in  
12 excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the  
13 bonds were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of  
14 debt service due on outstanding bonds. If the excess money,  
15 together with any available balance, exceeds the amount of debt  
16 service remaining to be paid, the money shall be transferred to  
17 the General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible  
18 for the debt service.

19 Section 7109. Transfers for government support agencies.

20 During the current fiscal year, any prior year amount  
21 unexpended on the effective date of this section may, upon the  
22 written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the Senate,  
23 the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of  
24 Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of  
25 Representatives, be transferred between any of the following  
26 accounts:

- 7 (10) Legislative Reapportionment Commission.
- 8 (11) Independent Regulatory Review Commission.
- 9 (12) Capitol Preservation Committee.
- 10 (13) Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
- 11 (14) Host State Committee expenses - CSG.
- 12 (15) Restricted Account for Leave Payout Expenses.

13 Section 7110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment  
14 Commission.

15 The appropriation in this act or in any other fiscal year to  
16 the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining unexpended  
17 and unencumbered on the effective date of this section may, upon  
18 the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the  
19 Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the  
20 House of Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of  
21 Representatives, be transferred to any other account of the  
22 Senate and the House of Representatives, as they deem necessary.

23 Section 7111. Administration of Human Services Block Grant.

24 The Department of Human Services shall allocate and disburse  
25 appropriations in this act for the Human Services Block Grant  
26 Program established under Article XIV-B of the act of June 13,  
27 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, to  
28 counties participating in that program. Each participating  
29 county may adjust the expenditure of the county's Human Services  
30 Block Grant Program allocation between those appropriations in

1 accordance with, and as authorized by, the applicable provision  
2 of Article XIV-B of the Human Services Code.

5 Section 8101. Effective date.
