29 PART I  
30 GENERAL PROVISIONS

1 Section 101. Short title.

2 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General  
3 Appropriation Act of 2025.

4 Section 102. Definitions.

5 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall  
6 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the  
7 context clearly indicates otherwise:

8 "COVID" or "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an  
9 infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome  
10 coronavirus 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in  
11 Wuhan, China.

12 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,  
13 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

14 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
15 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
16 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
17 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
18 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
19 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
20 other assistants in a department, board or commission.

21 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
22 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
23 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
24 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,  
25 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll  
26 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising  
27 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,  
28 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of  
29 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and  
30 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums

1 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on  
2 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer  
3 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee  
4 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,  
5 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and  
6 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the  
7 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery  
8 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment  
9 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other  
10 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for  
11 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of  
12 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term  
13 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the  
14 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must  
15 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case  
16 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that  
17 provided under the State medical assistance program.

18 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the  
19 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

26 (a) General Fund.--Except as provided in Part LI, the sums  
27 specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,  
28 are specifically appropriated from the General Fund to agencies  
29 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
30 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other

1 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
2 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
3 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
4 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
5 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
6 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
7 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
8 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes specified  
9 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of  
10 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior  
11 fiscal year.

12 (b) Special funds and accounts.--Except as provided in Part  
13 LI, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be  
14 necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special funds  
15 and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the Executive  
16 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of  
17 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the  
18 duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for  
19 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
20 purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any  
21 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for  
22 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and  
23 for the purposes specified in this act for the current fiscal  
24 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
25 at the close of the prior fiscal year.

26 Section 105. Federal appropriations.

27 Except as otherwise provided in Part LI, the Federal  
28 appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may  
29 be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of  
30 the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the

1 Commonwealth specified in this act for the payment of the  
2 expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs specified  
3 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of  
4 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior  
5 fiscal year. Unless otherwise stated, the Federal appropriations  
6 include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

8 For the purposes of this act, a reference to the Department  
9 of Criminal Justice shall be deemed to be a reference to the  
10 Department of Corrections or the Pennsylvania Parole Board, or  
11 both, as applicable.

25 policies, procedures and regulations instituted in accordance

27 Section 7104. Minority business set-asides.

28 (a) Duty to report.--Each department or other  
29 instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part  
30 II authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities,



1 equipment, supplies or services shall report to the General  
2 Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement  
3 needs at the beginning of each quarter during a fiscal year.

4 (b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "minority  
5 business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the  
6 act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the  
7 Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.  
8 Section 7105. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous  
9 sources.

10 In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act:

11 (1) Moneys received in payment for food and household  
12 supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except  
13 inmates, by an institution and moneys received from the  
14 proceeds from the sale of products of the soil, meats,  
15 livestock, timber or other materials sold by a department or  
16 agency of the Commonwealth shall be paid into the General  
17 Fund and are appropriated out of the General Fund to the  
18 several respective institutions for the operation and  
19 maintenance of the institutions.

20 (2) Moneys received from any other source, except the  
21 Federal Government, as contributions for the purposes  
22 specified in the respective appropriations or as payment for  
23 services or materials furnished by one institution to  
24 another, except those collections designated as revenues,  
25 shall be paid into the General Fund and are appropriated out  
26 of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective  
27 appropriations.

28 (3) Moneys received by a department or agency of the  
29 Commonwealth from other sources, except the Federal  
30 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department

1 or agency for a program or administration of an act included  
2 in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited  
3 to the appropriation for that program or administration of  
4 the act.

5 Section 7106. Lapsing of unused funds.

6 (a) General rule.--Except as otherwise provided by law or by  
7 this section, that part of all appropriations in this act  
8 unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of the close of the  
9 current fiscal year shall automatically lapse as of that day.

10 (b) Exceptions.--The following shall be continuing  
11 appropriations:

12 (1) The appropriation in section 236 to the Health Care  
13 Cost Containment Council.

14 (2) The appropriation in section 241 to the Supreme  
15 Court for the unified judicial system security program.

16 (3) The appropriations in Subpart C of Part II to the  
17 General Assembly.

18 (4) The appropriations in Subpart D of Part II to the  
19 Government Support Agencies.

20 (5) The appropriations in section 231 to the  
21 Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency for disaster relief,  
22 hazard mitigation and State disaster assistance.

23 (c) Nonapplicability.--This section does not apply to Part  
24 LI.

25 Section 7107. Appellate courts appropriation contingency.

26 The appropriations in sections 241, 242 and 243 to the  
27 Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Courts, respectively, for  
28 justice and judge expenses are contingent upon a vouchered  
29 expense account plan being continued by the Supreme Court.

30 Section 7108. Transfer of excess funds.

1 The Governor may transfer moneys in funds receiving proceeds  
2 of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in  
3 excess of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the  
4 bonds were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of  
5 debt service due on outstanding bonds. If the excess money,  
6 together with any available balance, exceeds the amount of debt  
7 service remaining to be paid, the money shall be transferred to  
8 the General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible  
9 for the debt service.

10 Section 7109. Transfers for government support agencies.

11 During the current fiscal year, any prior year amount  
12 unexpended on the effective date of this section may, upon the  
13 written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the Senate,  
14 the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of  
15 Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of  
16 Representatives, be transferred between any of the following  
17 accounts:

- 30 (12) Capitol Preservation Committee.

- 1 (13) Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
- 2 (14) Host State Committee expenses - CSG.
- 3 (15) Restricted Account for Leave Payout Expenses.

4 Section 7110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment  
5 Commission.

6 The appropriation in this act or in any other fiscal year to  
7 the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining unexpended  
8 and unencumbered on the effective date of this section may, upon  
9 the written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the  
10 Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the  
11 House of Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of  
12 Representatives, be transferred to any other account of the  
13 Senate and the House of Representatives, as they deem necessary.

14 Section 7111. Administration of Human Services Block Grant.

15 The Department of Human Services shall allocate and disburse  
16 appropriations in this act for the Human Services Block Grant  
17 Program established under Article XIV-B of the act of June 13,  
18 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, to  
19 counties participating in that program. Each participating  
20 county may adjust the expenditure of the county's Human Services  
21 Block Grant Program allocation between those appropriations in  
22 accordance with, and as authorized by, the applicable provision  
23 of Article XIV-B of the Human Services Code.

26 Section 8101. (Reserved).

27 Section 8102. Effective date.

28 This act shall take effect July 1, 2025, or immediately,  
29 whichever is later.
